Dear Colleague,

Following the last meeting of the Curatorium of the Hague Academy of international law, I have to inform you that the Curatorium has carefully considered the subjects of your proposed for your course to be delivered in 2012. The Curatorium chose the first one with the following title "Human Rights of Undocumented Migrants". I hope you will agree with this slightly changed title.

The course, to be given in English (and simultaneously translated into French) will consist of five fifty-minute lectures and only one two-hour seminar that will take place in the afternoon following your last lectures, so that those attending these lectures will have the opportunity to ask questions arising from it before addressing the subject set for the seminar itself.

I would like to draw to your attention that your course will have to be published, during the months after you have given it, in the *Academy's Collected Courses*, as well as in the electronic version, *with all rights being ceded to the Academy*. You will of course receive off-prints of your course as well as the bound volume in which it appears. Your manuscript should be sent in at the end of your course, or within the following six months at the latest. I would emphasize that these conditions are extremely important, while I apologize if they seem somewhat strict. This is because the continued publication of the *Collected Courses*, which is currently the most important encyclopedia of private and public international law, is one of the most essential foundations of the Academy. I would ask you, therefore, to indicate whether these conditions are acceptable.

I would also be very grateful if you would keep me informed of any change of address or of any other change in your situation.

I remain at your disposal for any further information that you might require.
